Jewfish Creek Bridge

Present plans are to replace the existing Jewfish Creek drawbridge with a fixed bridge having a clearance of 65 feet. According to news sources in the Keys, the Florida DOT held a series of meetings in late January, followed by Corps of Engineers meetings in early March, to brief the public and receive comments on the plans for the 18 miles stretch between Florida City and Key Largo. At the meetings, held in the Keys and at Homestead, DOT officials advised that the 18 mile stretch will remain two lanes, but that the shoulder on the north bound side would be paved so that it can be used as an additional traffic lane in the event of an evacuation. The present Jewfish Creek Bridge will be replaced with a fixed bridge with 65' There will be cloverleaf exits for access to Gilberts and the clearance. The bridge will actually extend across Lake Surprise from the Anchorage. Jewfish Creek area to Key Largo. It will replace the present causeway, which was built by Flagler for use by his railroad. Construction is expected to begin in 2005. Who knows, we might actually see the end of the "on the hour and half hour" openings of the Jewfish Creek Bridge in our lifetime.

on March 20th. The boat "Moderation" was traveling from Fort Lauderdale to Key West. It was going about 28 MPH struck the coral when it and subsequently damaged 300 to 400 yards of The boat owner and operator, the reef. who has 20 years of boating experience and has boated in the Keys before, said malfunctioned and he that his GPS thought he was in Hawks Channel, nearly two miles from where the grounding occurred. The fines for damaging the

coral reef start at \$100 for the fist square foot and \$75 a foot after that, plus possible additional costs for monitoring and restoration. Guess you could call that a damn expensive malfunction.

Minutes of the March Club Meeting

Commodore Bill Clemons and Linda were both home with the flu, so Vice Commodore George McDermot brought the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, March 1, 2004. Minutes of the February meeting were accepted as published in the March 2004 newsletter.

Old Business:

Use of the Park. There were two people present who were conducting a 5-7 minute survey on the use of the park for the South Florida Water Management District, and members were encouraged to do the survey. **Treasurer's Report:** Balance at the end of January was \$5,981.98, and ending balance at the end of February was \$6,443.41. The treasurer's report was accepted as read. A detailed treasurer's report will be included in the newsletter beginning with the next one published.

Newsletter: Bill Zinn has been doing the newsletter for the past 3 years and he would like to hand over this responsibility to a new editor as soon as one is set up and ready go. Bill reiterated that members have the opportunity to have their business card information included in the newsletter periodically (free advertising). The only requirement is that you send him your business card and ask that it be included in the newsletter. Also, members were urged to advise Bill of any changes in their e-mail address.

Website: Roger North suggested the possibility of putting the roster on the Web Site and updating as needed. However, Larry Roesch, Webmaster, advised that the information on the website could be viewed by anyone, and it was not a good idea to have our members personal information (Phone, fax, e-mail etc.) published there. However, he indicated that the member name and their boat name will be published. The web site has a mail box capability, which we do not use at this time, but is something that could be looked into. The calendar of events for 2004 will also be uploaded in the website and maintained current.

Phone Committee: Working well, and members were asked to keep their e-mail information updated. At least 55 people registered to attend the March 1 meeting.

Boca Chita: This event was very well attended with 12 boats present, and everyone had a great time. Thanks went out to George Mayer and Peter Dean and all those who helped to make this event a successful one.

Park Business: Buz Strandhagen indicated he had correspondence between the Park, Black Point, Dade County and HYC and would be happy to share the information if members had an interest. He indicated that Black Point has severe problems which they are addressing aggressively. They have been sending correspondence and setting up meetings with Dade County in an effort to have the problems resolved, but Dade County representatives sometimes do not show up. On the subject of oil spills, he advised that the National Park Service declared there should be no more oil spills in the park (high Octane, sun tan lotion etc.) If you would like more information on this topic, you should contact Buz.

New Business:

A sign up sheet was placed on each table so that Sonia could determine how many people would be attending in order to purchase the right amount of sea food. It is not too late to register and pay for the cruise, as there are still some spots available. Please contact Sonia Espineira for information.

Events for the remainder of the year will be addressed in future meetings and published in the newsletter.


