Lighthouse Trivia

According to BOATING magazine, all lighthouses in the United States are now unmanned except for the Boston Light on Little Brewster Island and that one is manned by a woman, Sally Snowman. She oversees maintenance performed on the lighthouse and personally cleans the lens once a week. Cleaning of the 336 individual prisms in the lens takes about three hours and is done with distilled water, isopropyl alcohol, and a few drops of Woolite. She says that the Woolite makes it sparkle.

Profile: Commodore Bill Clemons

Our Commodore is a truly rare find, a native born Floridian, having been born in Bradenton, Fl. While he was born here, he certainly didn't grow up here as his Father was in the Navy. He thus lived at numerous places around the country including San Diego where he met his future wife Linda. She was born and raised in San Diego and she and Bill attended High School They subsequently got married and after 33 years of marriage, together. have two children and six grand children. Bill, following in his Father's footsteps, also joined the Navy. He was trained and worked as an Air Traffic Controller before becoming an aircrew member. Bill was subsequently injured in an aircraft accident and after having served nine years, was discharged. Falling back on his earlier training, Bill took a job as an Air Traffic Controller for the FAA, a job he still holds today. His interest in boating goes back to age 13 when he was a licensed sail

In 1974 he acquired his first powerboat, a boater. 15' Swiss Six with a 50 Hp Evenrude outboard. Next was a 17', then a 22', then a 27', a 33', a 38', and finally their present 47' "Linda C Too". Bill and Linda have had a boat on the docks at Homestead since 1985 and have been HYC members since 1992. Bill holds a Captain's license and has completed Coast Guard boating courses. His favorite boating destination is the Bahamas, having made several visits over the years. Commodore is not a new title around the Clemons' household. Bill is not the first to hold that title; Linda was the club's first and thus far only female Commodore in 1996.
