Minutes of the HYC Meeting on December 7, 2009

First speaker of the evening, Dockmaster Mike McCrink. Mike reports that the park had over 300 children for the annual fishing tournament. Maintenance: they are pressure cleaning the docks and cleaning up dry storage. Nothing has been decided on the budget so there are no part time positions open. The county surveyed the docks and decided the following: A dock slips are 40 to 45 feet, B dock 35 feet on west side and 40 on the east side. C, D and E are 30 feet. Only people affected will be on C dock as they are now 35 feet. All slips at the T are larger. Marina patrons will receive a letter soon explaining what has changed.

Motion made and seconded to accept the minutes from last month as they appeared in the newsletter.
