### **Mooring Buoy and Marker Plan ReVisited**

The latest revisions to Biscayne National Park's Mooring Buoy and Marker Plan were explained to HYC members at our February meeting. The Park's Chief of Resource Management, Elsa Alvear, and Chief Park Ranger, Didier Carod, explained the status of the Plan and answered Club member's questions. Ms Alvear explained that the Plan has been revised/updated because of the overwhelming negative public response to the original version of the plan. She explained that the intent of the plan is not to ban anchoring in the Park or to

ban the Columbus Day Regatta. Many of the Plan's proposals seemed well received by Club members, such as increased markers around the Feather Beds, informational markers in the channels entering the Park so that boaters know they are entering the National Park, and a ban on using anchors on ship wreck sites and the reef. As with the original version of the Plan, the item which prompted the most concerns and questions was their plan to limit the number of boats allowed to anchor in the vicinity of the sand bar at Sands Cut. Ranger Carod stated that there are usually more than 100 boats at the sand bar on weekends, that most of the calls for assistance originate from the sand bar area and that the Park simply does not have sufficient ranger staffing to adequately police that area. The revised plan calls for the installation of 70 mooring pins around the sand bar. Anchoring and beaching will not be



permitted and thus the number of boats permitted in the area will be limited to 70. When asked where he thought the boaters would go if all 70 mooring pins are in use, and his response was, "somewhere else". Since most HYC members anchor in the University Dock area rather than at the sand bar, the concern is that if the weekend boaters can not anchor at the sand bar, they will move south to the small beaches located north and south of University Dock. Ms Alvear explained that there will be another round of public meetings to obtain comments on the revised plan and that they hope to finalize the plan by the end of 2011.

Also present from the Park Service were Chief Park Ranger Didier Carod and Jackie Ayala, an environmental policy intern. The presentation included pictures, maps and explanations of the proposed plan to protect the park and coral reefs. They also passed out pamphlets to interested members. Elsa Alvear quickly assured the audience that the Park Service had no plans to end anchoring in the bay. Dwayne Powell questioned whether or not the national park service had anything to do with our problems with the channel leading from the marina and Ms. Alvear assured him that the solution to that problem lies strictly with Dade County. The presentation ended with questions for and answers from Ms. Alvear and Didier Carod with regards to more law enforcement in the bay. We were informed that the department charged with that was seriously undermanned.

Treasurer's Report: presented by Sharon Roesch as Dee Riley was unable to attend. Opening balance \$4,531.10 on Dec 1, 2010 and closing balance \$5377.85 on Jan 31, 2011. Full reports appear elsewhere in the newsletter.
