## **Park Service Meetings**

The National Park Service has two public meetings scheduled during August to discuss their Mooring Buoy and Marker Plan for Biscayne National Park. They describe the purpose of this plan as "to reduce damage to post resources, enhance visitor opportunities, increase safety of navigation in the park, and improve the effectiveness of park operations." This plan has the potential to impact everyone that goes boating in the Park. A portion of their plan reads as follows: "One action is to test shallow water mooring fields to determine if they can take the place of beaching and anchoring in crowded areas such as Biscayne Channel and Sands Cut." The purpose of the meeting is to explain the plan and receive public comment. The meeting will be from 6 to 8 PM, with a brief Park Service presentation at 6:30 PM.
