Minutes of HOMESTEAD YACHT CLUB June 2010 Meeting

The Homestead Yacht Club meeting was called to order at 7:10PM, June 7th, 2010 by Commodore Larry Roesch.

The speaker of the evening was Mr. Mark Lewis, Superintendent of Biscayne National Park. Mr Lewis explained the Park Services responsibility to maintain the Park, in it's natural state, for future generations. He discussed the decline in the number and size of fish in the Park and planned changes to address that and other problems. He also addressed the Gulf oil spill, plans for Stiltsville, the Park's volunteer program, and the conduct/attitude of Park Rangers.

Membership: Dwayne Powell, Membership Chairman said the wording in the minutes should be changed from "members" to "memberships". He reported that we are getting several boats arriving in the marina and should produce some members for the club.

Treasurer's Report: Beginning balance: \$5385.29, Ending Balance: \$4922.79

Marina Liason: Buz and Claire are in Texas. Reported from Mike: The "Beach House" Snack Bar is to be torn down and it will be replaced with new bath houses in approximately nine months. The marina is also getting new water and sewer treatments.

Sunshine: Jan had nothing to report.

Events: Thanks to Jerry and Vicky Cline for the fantastic **Italian Feast Event**. Food was great, weather was great. Park Super Addresses HYC

Biscayne National Park Superintendent Mark Lewis was the guest speaker at the Homestead Yacht Club's June meeting. He addressed present Park activities, plans for the future, and also responded to member's questions.

He began by explaining that the Park seems to have a serious identity crisis. Their research has shown that



many people in the Miami area do not even know where the Park is located, much less what facilities/attractions the Park has. Highlights of his other comments are as follows:

Park Management: The Park Service is responsible for maintaining the Park in such a manner that our grandchildren's grandchildren can enjoy it as nature created it. He pointed out that in some instances, they have not done the best job of meeting that responsibility. The status of the fish population in the Bay was cited as an example. Years ago when he was a ranger at Everglades National Park, he used to fish often in the Bay and almost always saw big fish. Now it is unusual to see a legal size fish, much less a big fish. A new General Management plan and a Fishery Management Plan are being developed to address maintenance and hopefully restoration of some of the Park's resources. These plans will include such things as boating speed zones and fish "no take" zones. One of the no take zones will probably be on the east (ocean) side of Elliott Key, extending north from Ceasars Creek. He pointed out that obviously not everyone will like these new rules/restrictions, but they are essential to meeting their responsibility to preserve the Park for future generations.

Gulf Oil Spill: Mr Lewis stated that the National Park's Incident Management team is in place and that there is continuous sampling of the areas around Biscayne National Park, Everglades National Park and the Dry Tortugas. Contingency plans and equipment are in place in case oil slicks, tar balls, oil sheens, etc are detected.

Boca Chita: In response to several questions/comments regarding visiting Boca Chita, docking there, over night docking, etc, Mr Lewis clarified that the fee charged there is an over night usage fee and not a docking fee. The rules regarding use of the facility are posted in the shelter by the dock. So far as he knows, there is no restriction on the playing of radios, on or off the vessel, unless someone complains. If that happens then it is up to the Ranger to evaluate the situation and resolve it. Several members commented favorably about the volunteer who assists in managing the facilities. Mr Lewis thanked them for their comments and took the opportunity to urge members to look into the Park's volunteer program. He stated that it is an excellent way to support your Park and they certainly welcome the help.

Stiltsville: After a short history of Stiltsville and how the Park gained ownership, he addressed the present status. A non-profit organization, the Stiltsville Trust, has been formed to assist the Park in management and oversight of the buildings. The goal is to have the buildings available for use by individuals and organizations. The hope is to eventually have a web site where people could request reservations. A major problem not yet resolved is what to charge for use of the facilities. The charge will have to cover insurance as well as the cost of a full time ranger while the building is being used. They hope to have this issue resolved soon.

Ranger Conduct: There were several question/comments regarding the attitude/conduct of Park Rangers, especially at Boca Chita. Mr Lewis explained that there is a Chief Ranger who is responsible for all of the Rangers; however, they are all ultimately his responsibility. He is especially concerned if some are being disrespectful as that reflects negatively on all of the Park employees. He stated that if you get a ticket from a ranger that you feel you do not deserve, that is between you and the judge, "I am not in the ticket fixing business"; however, if a ranger is disrespectful or projects a generally poor attitude, he wants to know. Business cards containing his direct phone number were made available for HYC members.
