At times our cruise through Georgia seemed like traveling in the Appalachian Mountains as the winding ICW often made you feel you were back where you just had come from. However, we saw some beautiful secluded anchorages and miles of undeveloped marsh and woodland. It is scenery like this that causes you to realize the ICW is a destination unto itself. We arrived at the Isle of Hope Marina near Savannah at sunset and were greeted with a bunch of irritating tiny see-ums called sand flies. Downtown Savannah is about 8 miles up the Savannah River from the ICW. The river is busy with commercial traffic and has some strong currents but it is wide and well marked. The riverfront area is worth a visit but the dockage historically has not been that good (rumor is improvements are being made). I recommend staying in Isle of Hope or Thunderbolt and taking a cab to downtown. In the spring Savannah is truly a beautiful place with its azaleas and dogwoods in full bloom beneath the huge oak trees filled with moss. Before going to Savannah a must read is the book *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil* by John Berendt. The book is a page-turner with remarkable characters blended with an excellent portrait of Savannah. Over the years a lot of movies have been filmed in and around Savannah *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil (1997)* and *Forrest Gump (1994)* to name two. Numerous tours are available and will add to your enjoyment of this historical city. Our next stop was Hilton Head where we spent

several days with friends. The beach at Hilton Head offers very little, but building laws on the island has resulted in the buildings on the island being blended with the foliage and has preserved the island's charm. If you are a golfer, Hilton Head is for you. Twenty miles further up the intracoastal is a favorite of mine, Beaufort, South Carolina. The town has beautiful homes and a lot of history and is a good place to spend a day or two. We consider the Royal Palm Landing Marina to be one of the most friendly on the ICW. The movie *Big Chill (1983)* was filmed in Beaufort. Charleston is the next stop along the intracoastal and the Charleston City Marina is downtown and recommended. There is an anchorage just off the city marina but it can get rough due to boat traffic and strong current. Next month more about Charleston plus Georgetown and Myrtle Beach.

<u>Everglades National Park – General Management Plan</u>

The Park Service has recently issued their newsletter # 5, outlining the latest proposals for the new Everglades General Management Plan. This is the midway point in a process which began in 2007 and is supposed to be completed in 2011. The plan outlines how the park will be managed and operated in future years, with emphasis on protecting the Park's resources. A major part of this protection effort is the controlling of boat use within the park. If you enjoy fishing in Florida Bay, then their proposals are of special interest to you. Also, if you live in or visit the Keys and enjoy dinking around the area, it should be of interest to you, because all of the water west and north of the Intercoastal Waterway, from Jewfish Creek to south of Islamorada, is part of the National Park and is covered by this plan. There are four Plan alternatives, but number one is simply the present management plan and serves only as a baseline for their proposed changes. The other three alternatives propose varying degrees of change ranging from minor in alternative two to extensive in alternative four. The following elements are common to all of the alternatives:

Improve Park boundary markings, channel markings and navigational aids

Rebuild the facilities at Flamingo, including the lodge/motel

Continue to protect nesting and rookery areas in the Florida Bay keys

Require a permit to operate a vessel in the Park and establish an education program which must be completed in order to obtain the permit

Establish/improve boat launch ramps at Flamingo and on the 18 mile stretch.

Increase law enforcement within the Park

The Park Service will be holding public meetings to explain the alternatives and to accept public comments on them. The meetings will be from 5:30 to 8:30 PM, with a briefing at 6 PM followed by a public comment period. The next three meetings will be on April 1 at the South Dade Public Library, 10750 SE 211 St, on April 13 at the Key Largo Holiday Inn and on April 14 at the Campbell Agricultural Center, 18710 SW 288 St. Also, the April 13 meeting will be webcast at 6 PM on the Park Service web site.
