Details of the Miami River Cruise event scheduled for June 9th were discussed. Members were reminded to advise Dee Riley after making your reservations.


The possibility of a raft up event in July was discussed, but no firm plans were made.

During one week in May, a 33 ft catamaran (left) and a 361 ft nuclear submarine (right) were both damaged by fire while in port. The *Keynoter* reported that the catamaran was docked at Boot Key marina in Marathon when it suffered serious fire damage. The same week, *AP* reported that the nuclear submarine USS Miami sustained serious fire

damage while in dry dock at Portsmouth Ship Yard. Both fires are believed to have been caused by electrical problems.


