Minutes, Regular Meeting Monday, February 4, 2008

Commodore Dave opened the meeting at 7:35 p.m.

Marina Update:

- Steve advised that he brought with him for distribution, new Travel documents effective January 31, 2008 required by Border Control.
- The Marina Social will take place February 23, 2008 at the Pavilion. No alcohol will be served. BYOB. Time is from Noon 400 P.M.
- The Marina Car Classic will take place February 24, 2008. There will be 150 cars, and entertainment for kids.
- The fishing tournament is planned for June 9<sup>th</sup>. The Marina is hoping for bigger participation from marina patrons this year.
- The park is experiencing issues because mechanics entering the park to work on the boats are leaving oil filters and other boat parts in the bins that are provided for other things. Mechanics are required to remove their trash, boat parts etc. from the marina. If the problem continues, mechanics will be banned from doing work on boats in the marina. The Park management has worked very hard to receive the "Clean Marina" designation and would like to keep the park safe for all patrons.
- The phone number for Security is still the same. Those numbers are always provided at the end of the newsletter. Please note them for future reference.
- Boat Show tickets are going out in the mail February 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Treasurer Sharon Roesch informed there were two reports (December '07 and January '8) because we had no meeting in January due to the Change of Watch. The ending balance in December was US\$5,088.71, and the ending balance in January was \$5,467.03. The Change of Watch was attended by 61 members and 9 guests. Details of the reports will be included in the Newsletter.

#### Membership:

Dwayne Powell informed that there were 36 paid up memberships to date. He introduced 1 new Member – Ray and Flora Vega and Ray received his club burgee from Commodore Dave who welcomed all new members.

#### **Roster:**

Sandy Zinn was doing the rounds reviewing her working copy of the current member information to ensure she received any new updates. All changes should be sent to her attention as quickly as possible so that the Roster information could be corrected before published.

#### **Newsletter:**

Anna Giuliani informed that the Newsletter went out and 6 members were receiving it by mail. However, she felt that some had old addresses that need to be corrected, as well as some old e-mail addresses. Both Anna and Dwayne requested that members update their e-mail and home addresses. Members rejoining were urged to update their information on the membership application form located on the club's web site.

#### Ship's Store:

There was lots of new stuff available for sale and congratulations went out to Ken and Linda Johnson for doing such a good job. Commodore Dave indicated that he would be exploring the possibility of having the Ship's Store materials stored at the Redland Golf and Country Club instead of having the Ship Store inventory transported back and forth for each meeting since it was becoming difficult for the club to find volunteers, and to expect those volunteers to do this over long periods of time. If possible, this will be brought up in the future for a vote as some funding will be required.

Commodore Dave introduced two new "Call Girls" who are Lucia Larson and Liz "Betty" Phillips.

Commodore Dave and Vice-Commodore Bob are hosting the February event, which will be a breakfast (February 16, 2008) at the Pavilion in the Park. A sign up sheet was placed on each table as they needed a headcount. The breakfast was free of charge to members and guests will pay \$5.00 per head. Breakfast will start at 9:00 a.m. – Noon. This is a good time for members to be at the Marina together, and the Pavilion was reserved.

Ken and Mike will host the March event (March 1<sup>st</sup>) at Card Point. Some members will go to Card Point to clean up the beach prior to the event so that on March 1<sup>st</sup>, the beach will be ready for the event. This is an event co-sponsored with Black Point yacht club. A Conch or Fish chowder with roasted corn will be served. Participants can BBQ on the beach also. BYOB, folding chairs, your chips and dips etc. E-mail notices will go out on February 27 as a reminder if the weather is not bad. A dinghy is necessary to get to the beach but there will be people who can ferry members to the beach if necessary. There is deep water in front of the beach for anchoring out. Commodore Dave requested that copies of the charts be available at the February breakfast.

Commodore Dave asked the members to think about events they would like to have during the remainder of the year and all suggestions are welcome.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.
