Another Invader

Another critter has been added to the list of invasive species that have established a foothold in our area. This uninvited guest is the Tegu lizard which can grow to four feet in length. Breeding colonies of the lizard have been found in the Tampa area, the Homestead/Florida City area and the eastern Everglades. Recently one of the lizards was seen in Key Largo. The Tegu feeds on fruit, vegetables, eggs, cat/dog food, small lizards and rodents. A mature female Tegu will lay around 35 eggs each year. During cold weather the Tegu will dig



a burrow and can survive temperatures as low as 35F. The FWC advises against trying to catch the Tegu as they have sharp teeth and claws. If you see one, FWC asks that you photograph it and report the sighting to them by calling 888-483-4681 or going to their web site at IveGot1.org.
