Minutes Homestead Bayfront Yacht Club June 26, 2006

Meeting called to order by Cmdr. Powell at 7:40 p.m.....late cause her watch stopped at 7:15.....first order of business no changes to the minutes of last meeting as shown in the newsletter. Our dock master Steve was in attendance and reported the following:

1. Channel markers are out for bid.
2. Don't forget National Marina Day flea market on August 12th...it's a chance to clean out the garage.
3. Fire suppression system should be fully automatic by next meeting.
4. Fishing tournament was a success with 62 boats participating....Homestead took second and third place overall.
5. Reminded us that fueling boats from cans and/or drums is against County rules. He will be asking two patrons to move their boats this month due to breaking this rule.
6. Further reminder that any boat deemed to be hazardous to other boats due to faulty lines or tie-ups will be "corrected" by the dock master and charged \$75.00 per hour and .89 cents per foot for line appropriate for tying up boats.
7. We should be getting a survey (or as Steve put it "my report card") in the mail soon. Please be sure to fill it out and add any comments which would improve the service at our marina.
8. Traffic control will again be in effect for the 4th of July weekend with Miami-Dade Police as part of the operation. If you are coming to the marina on that weekend be sure that your marina patron sticker is prominently displayed as the police will allow you to enter.
9. Remember that maintenance and minor repairs are the only things allowed on the dock.

Steve then answered questions for members and was thanked for the great job he does for us.

- *New Business: Captain's License. Larry Roesch advised that if we got 10 or more participants we could receive a 10% discount on the cost (\$425 ea). A discussion followed regarding the need for DOT approved drug test and physicals required. The License is a Six Pack Coast Guard Captain's License. Instructor is from Fort Pierce and has a 90% pass rate on his classes. He also runs classes for the Fire Department. Classes would be from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m., five weekdays plus Saturday and Sunday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Black Point already has 30 people registered. Classes must be for the entire group together and participants must have 365 days on the water in a 5-year period. People can get their own physicals. A concern was voiced that boaters with this license could potentially expose themselves to risk of more lawsuits if they made mistakes but the upside would be the impact of reductions on insurance premiums. DUIs had to be disclosed.*
